

This course enables students to understand the issues and the functioning of the principle of the free movement of persons. Are discussed first economic activities that can have a national of one of the 27 Member States, independently or as employed (principle of free movement, limitations and role of harmonization). Then will be studied the development of the free movement of citizens, as the fundamental status of nationals of a Member State of the European Union. Finally, the free movement of nationals of Member States is put in the context of building an area of freedom, security and justice (Union policies related to free movement, immigration policy, asylum, the development of police and judicial cooperation...).
